

LEVEL 4 APPRENTICESHIP EARLY YEARS ADVANCED PRACTITIONER



This Level 4 qualification aims to provide professional development opportunities for practitioners working in the early years workforce at Level 3. You will acquire and use skills of leadership, mentoring, coaching and reflection as you complete the qualification through work-based learning opportunities. The Advanced Practitioner will use crucial leadership skills to mentor others across all roles and responsibilities in the early year's workforce.

Entry Requirements

You must be employed in an Early Years Setting at Level 3. Evidence of your level 3 qualification will need to be provided. You must also be working with all three age groups of children; babies, toddlers and pre-school, to be able to complete the qualification.

Mandatory units to be covered:

- Enabling children to learn
- Promoting health and well-being through physical activity and nutrition co-ordination (PANCo) in the early years
- Working with others to support children with additional needs, including Special Educational Needs and Disability
- Working with families and other professionals in early years settings
- Implementing change in an early years setting incorporating a small scale research project

How long will it take?

The Level 4 Apprenticeship for Early Years Advanced Practitioner will take a minimum of 16 months to complete.
